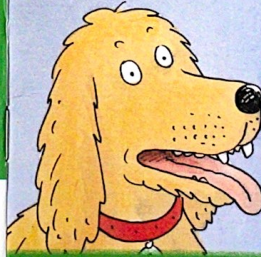

BEFORE READING

Talk together

- Look at the cover and read the title. Talk about the tooth fairy, and what happens when a loose tooth comes out.
- If your child has had a wobbly tooth, talk about what happened.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

had Mum it Dad on
hit upset not sad

- Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

her was wobbly
tooth wanted
out went swing
pushed gone
swallowed sorry



DURING READING

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the words:

- Ask your child to point from left to right under each word whilst reading.
- Model how to sound out and blend new words if necessary.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Use the pictures to talk about the story and learn the meaning of new words.

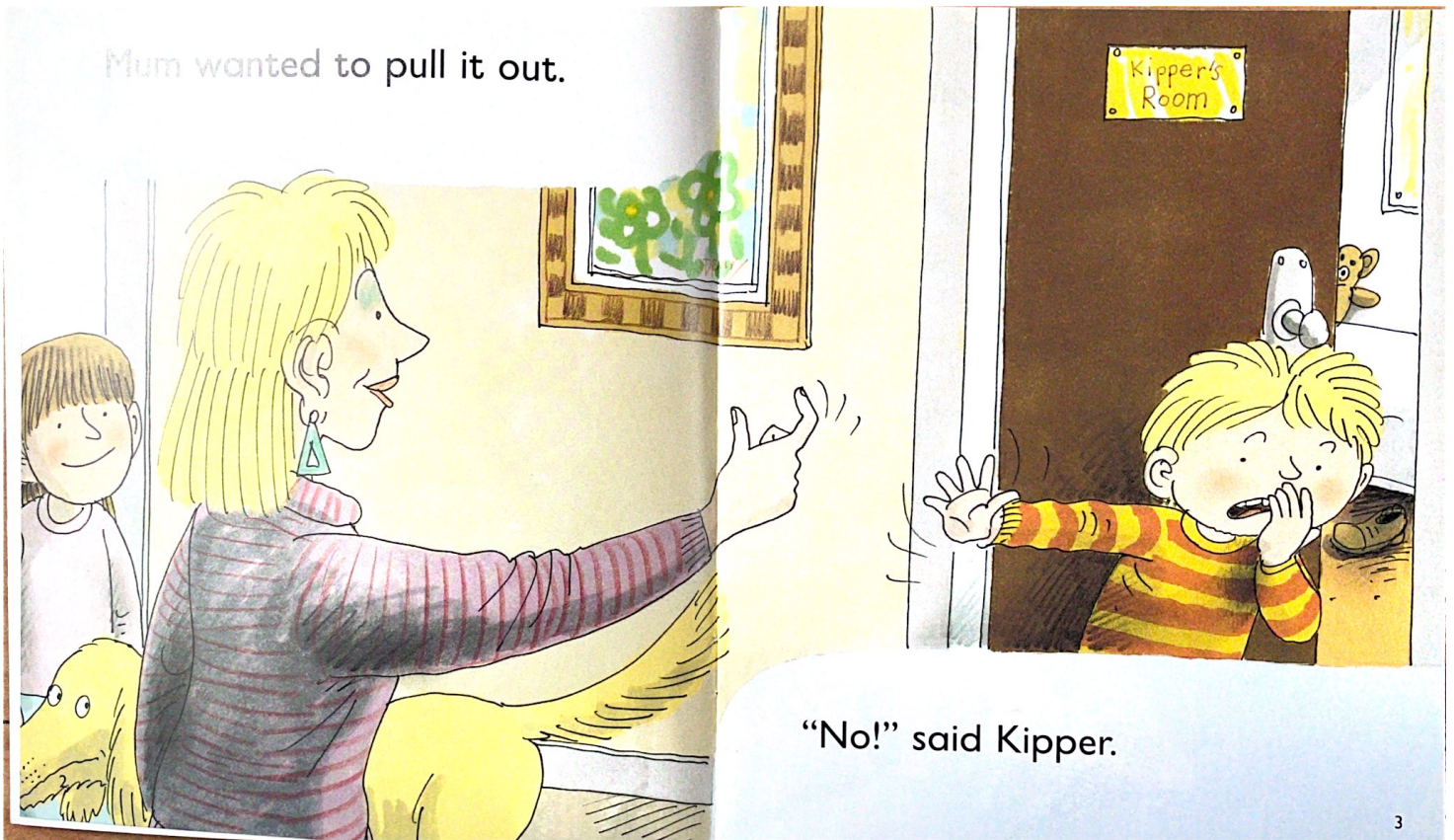

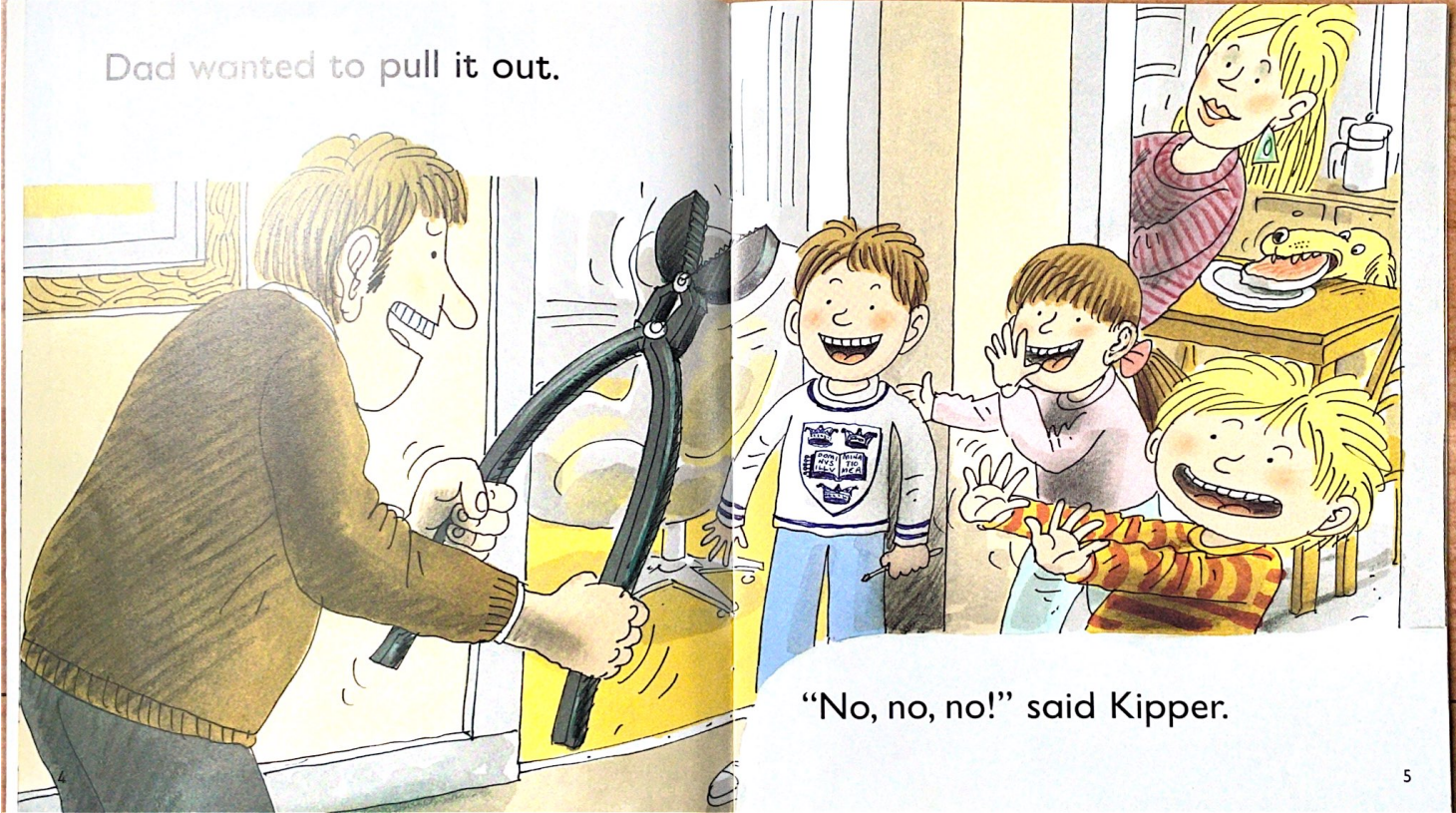
Kipper had a wobbly tooth.

Mum wanted to pull it out.



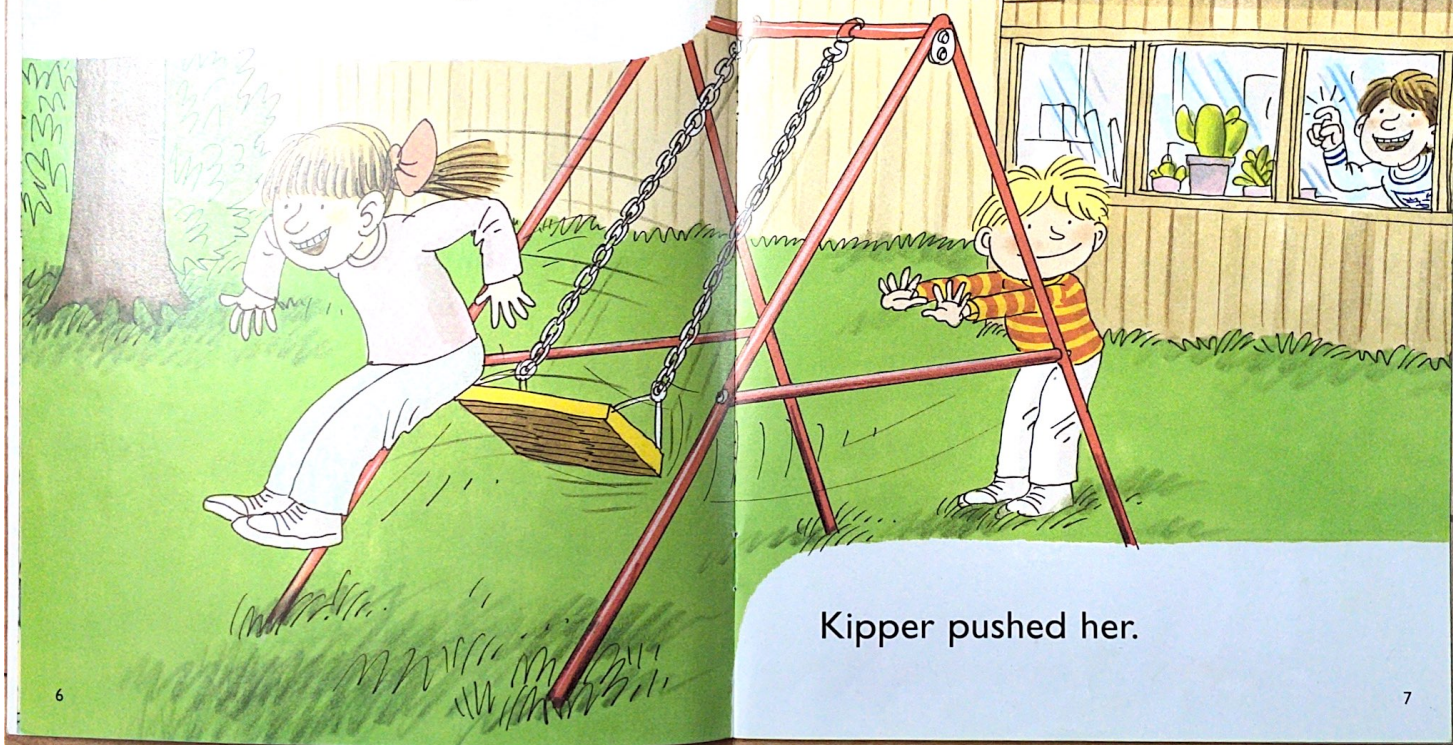
"No!" said Kipper.

Dad wanted to pull it out.



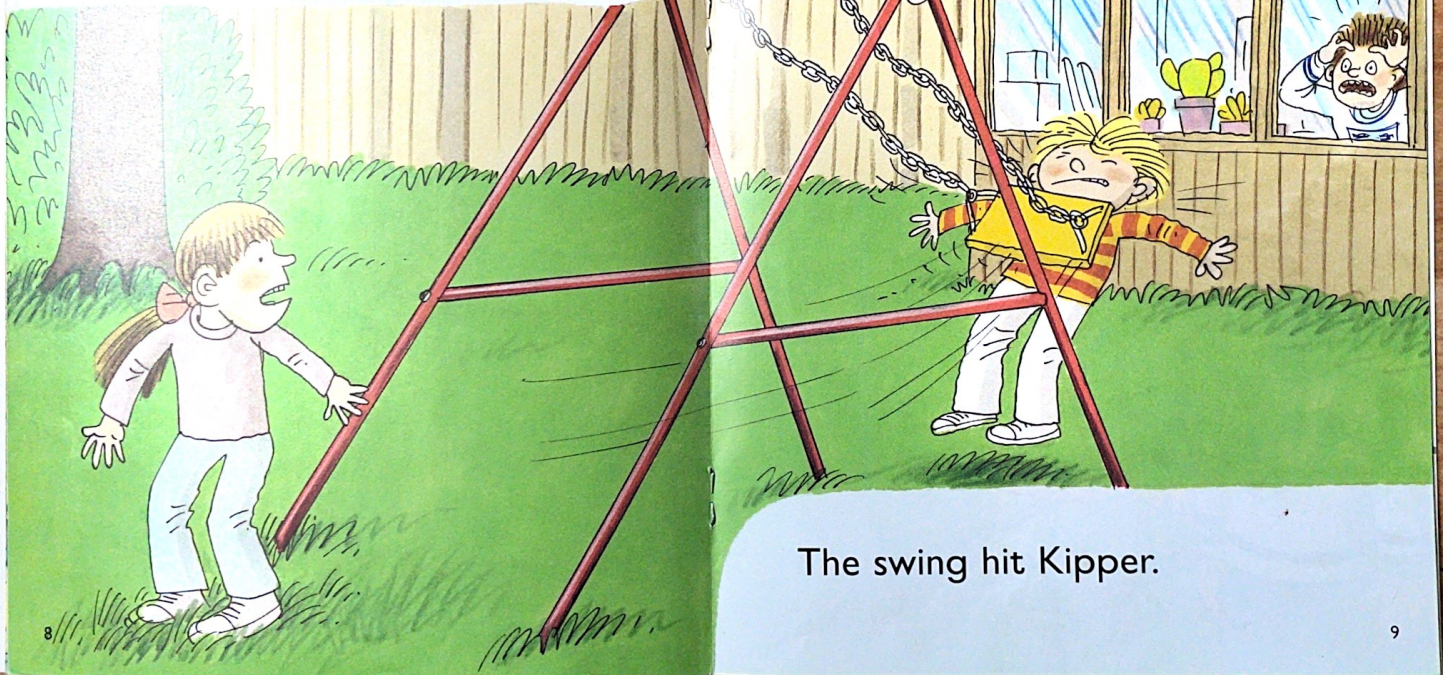
“No, no, no!” said Kipper.

Biff went on the swing.



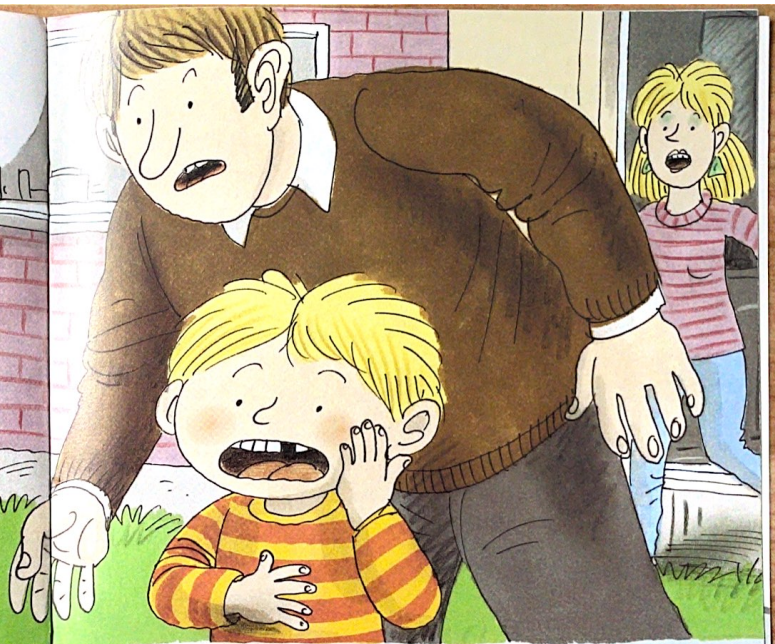
Kipper pushed her.

Oh no!



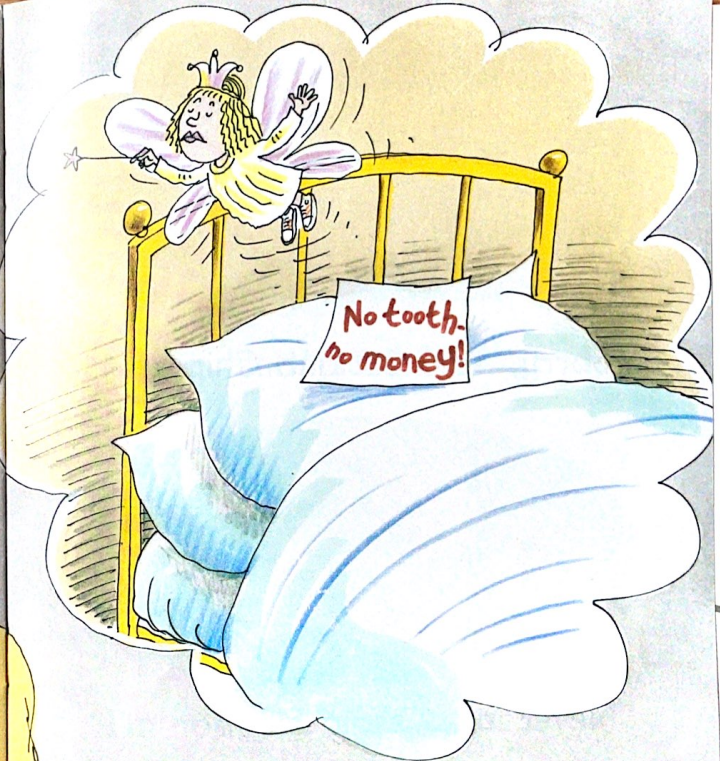
The swing hit Kipper.
