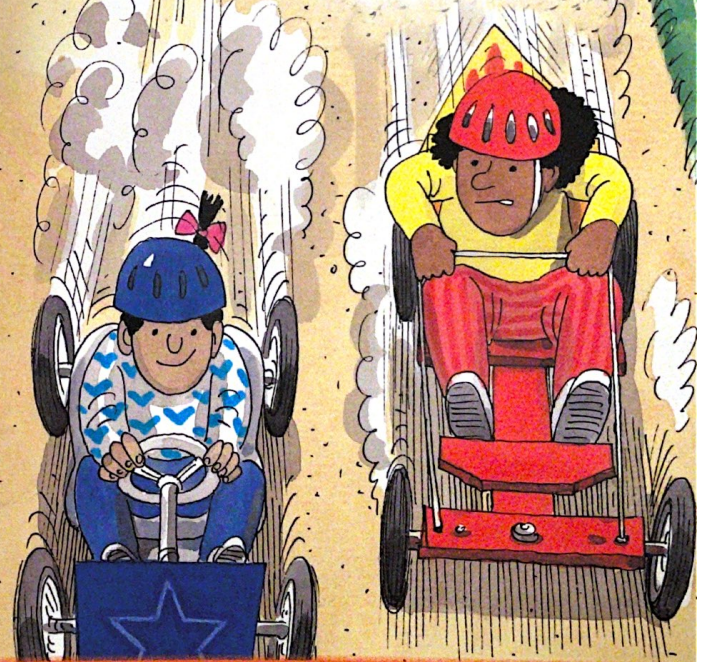

**BEFORE READING**

**Talk together**

- Look at the cover and read the title together. Ask: *Who do you think will win the race?*
- Talk about the go-karts on the cover and how they are steered.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

**About the words in this book**

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

**old about made came  
 saw make put go-karts  
 found rusty place prize**

- Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

 couldn't idea cheered  
 crashed notice  
 tossed worry**



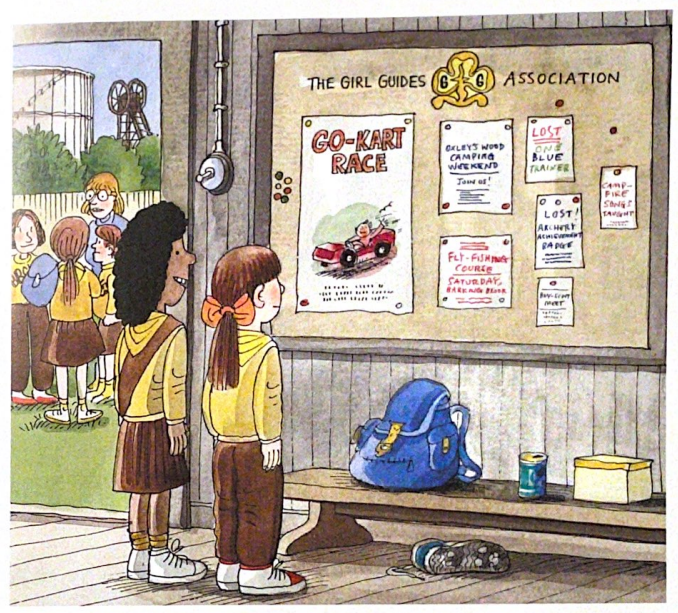
**DURING READING**

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:

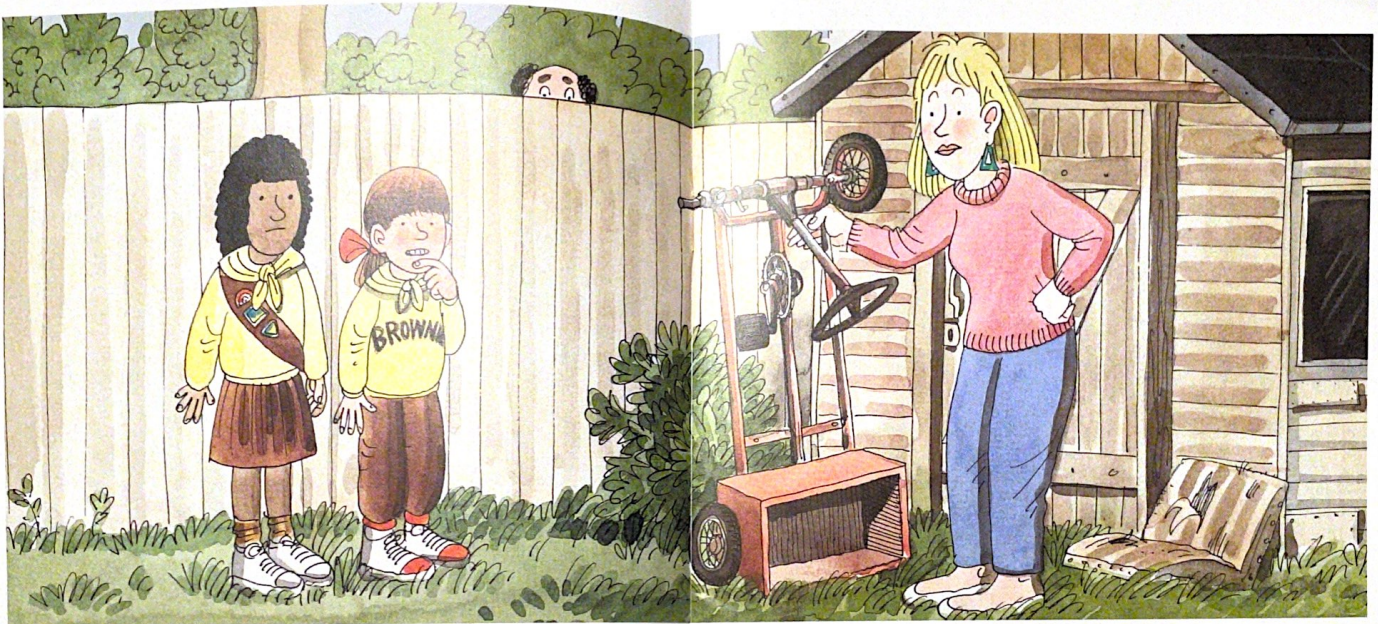
- Remind your child to blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.

Wilma and Biff saw a notice. It was about a go-kart race. Wilma had an idea. She told Biff about it.

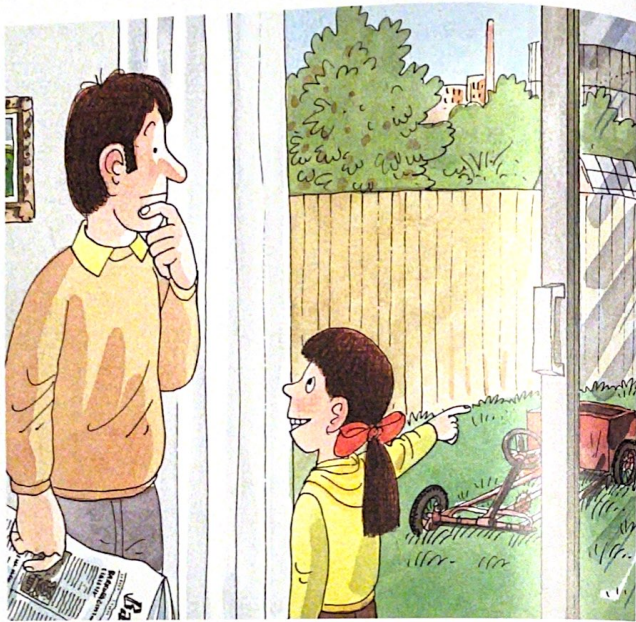


Biff and Wilma were excited. They told Mum about the race.

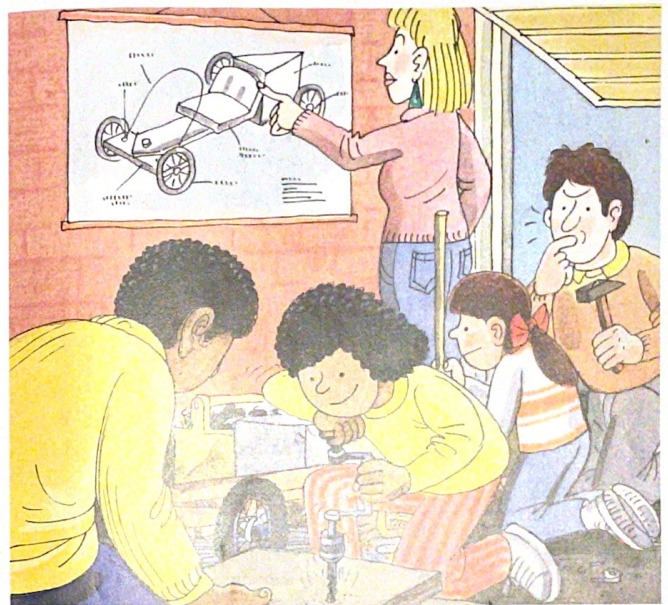
“We need a go-kart,” said Biff. “What about the old one?”

“This one is broken,” he said. “But we can make a new one.”

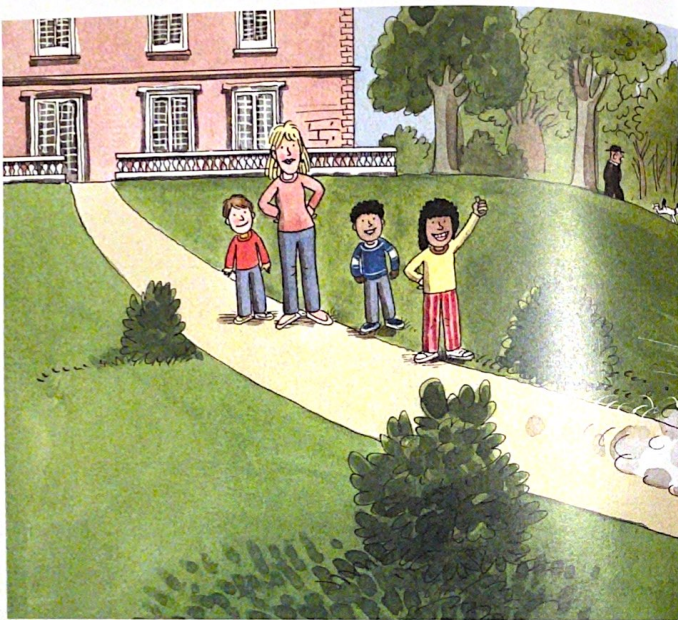


The mums and dads made a new go-kart. Everyone wanted to help. Biff and Mum looked at the plans. Wilma helped her dad.

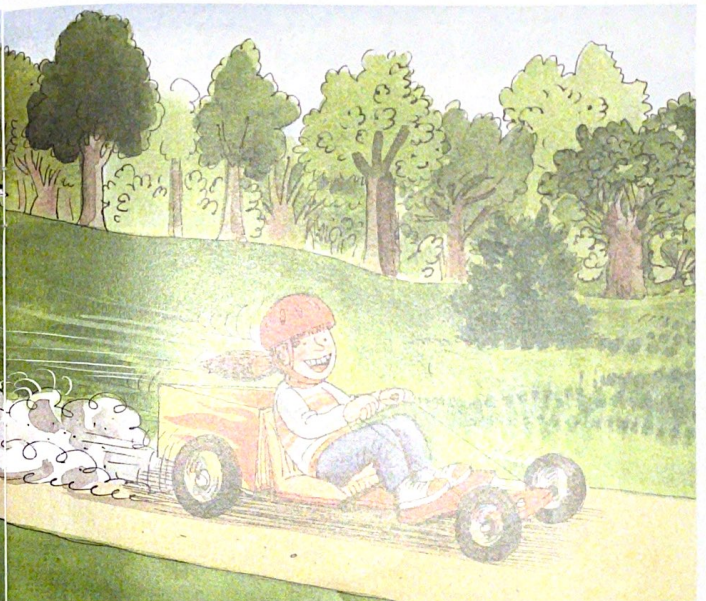


Mum painted the go-kart. Chip helped.

"It looks brilliant!" said Biff.

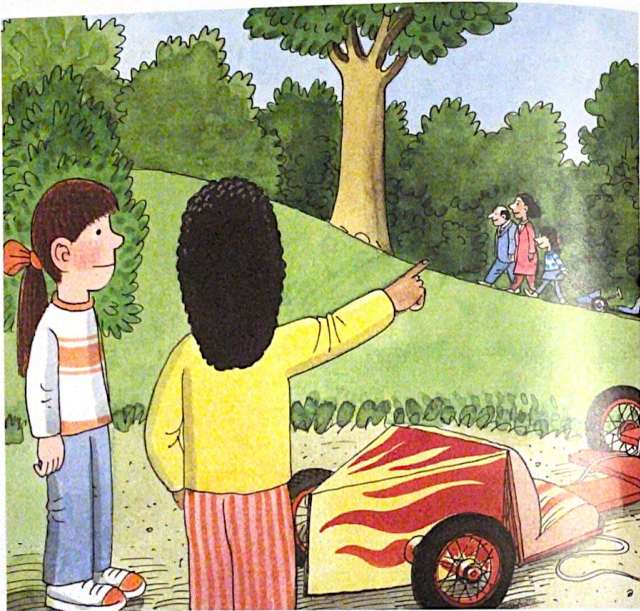
Everyone looked at the new go-kart. Biff

Suddenly, a dog ran in front of Anneena. Her go-kart crashed into a bush. Wilma crashed into Anneena.

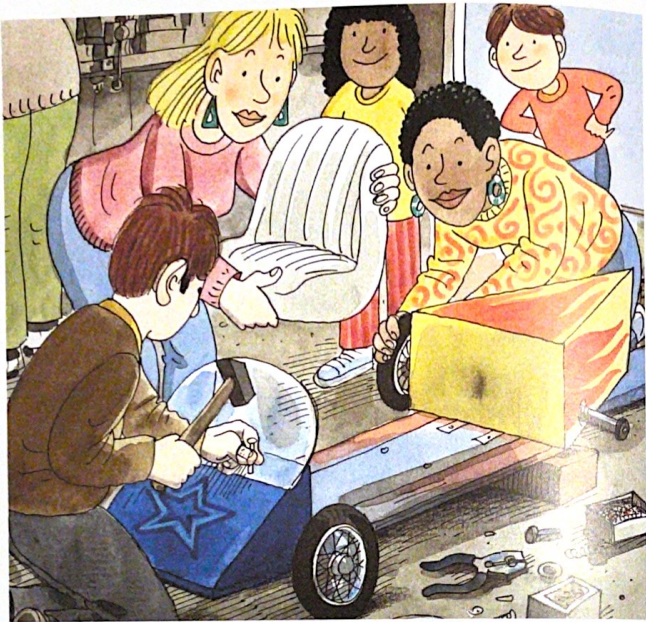




Everyone looked at the go-karts. Wilma's front wheels were bent. Anneena's go-kart was broken. Everyone was upset.

"What a brilliant idea!" said Mum.

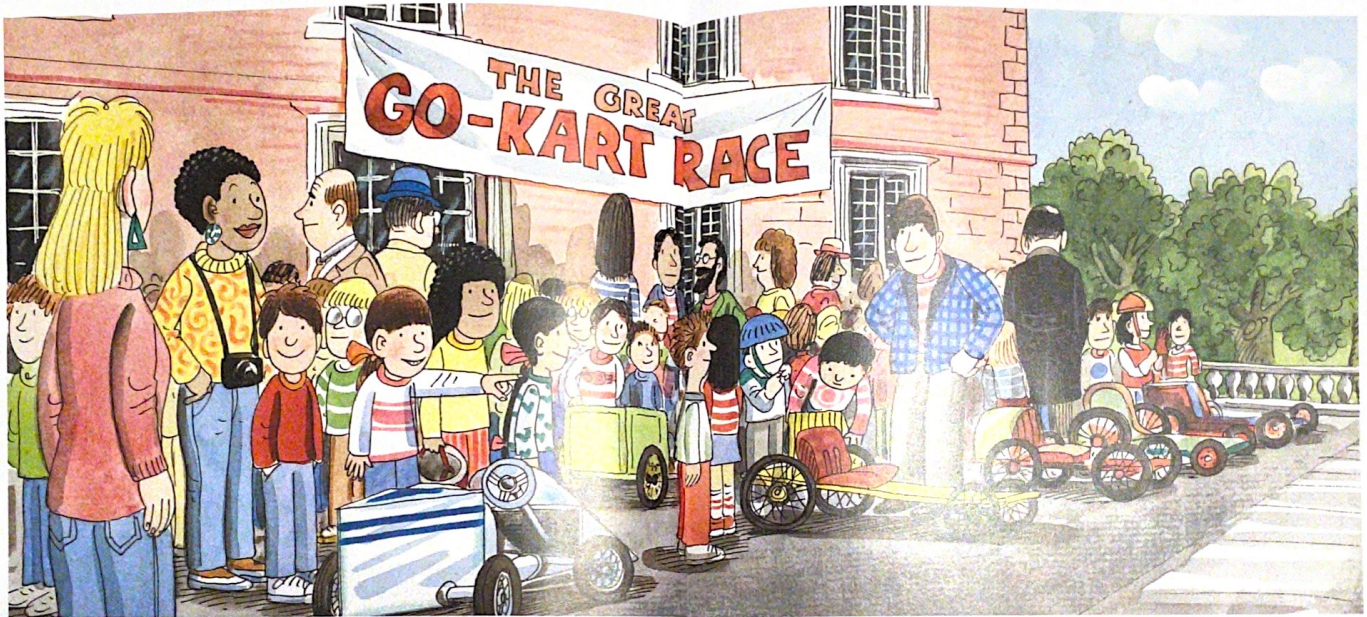


The mums and dads made a new go-kart. They made one go-kart out of two. They put the front of Anneena's go-kart on the back of Wilma's.



The children liked the new go-kart. They called it Silver Bullet.

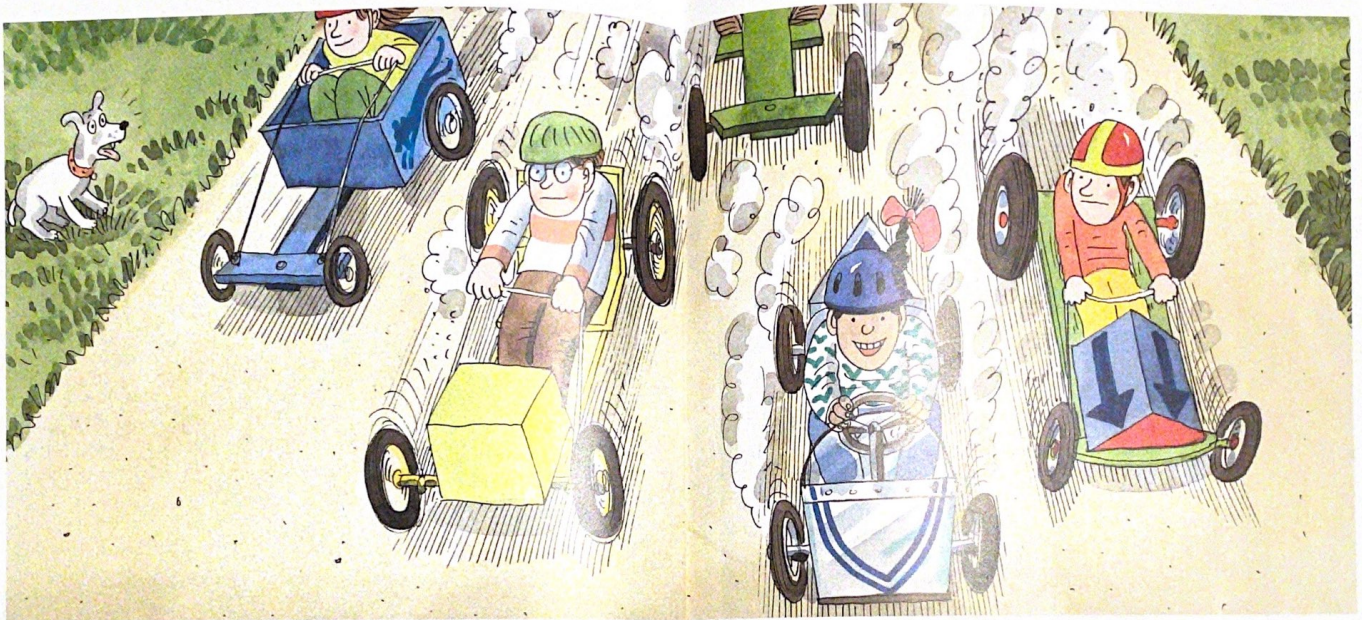
"What about the race?" asked Biff. "I bet Silver Bullet will win."



It was the day of the race. Everyone was excited.

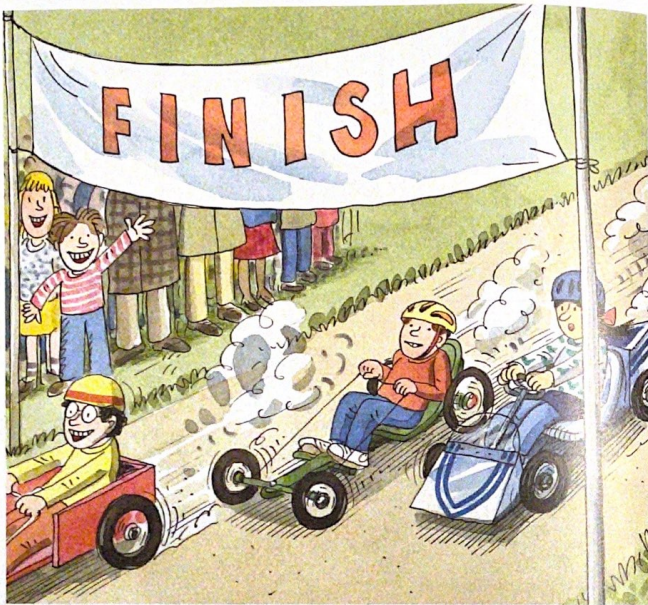
“Look at all the go-karts!” said Biff.

“Come on, Anneena!” called Biff.

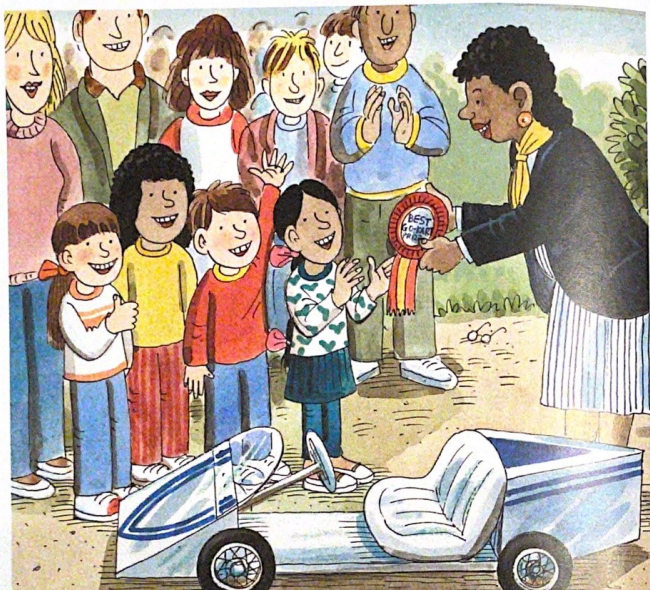
The go-karts raced down the hill.
