Recycling

A number of children have started wearing necklaces and bracelets to school. This is a health and safety issue. A child was recently injured because jewellery had been caught accidently. Please could children keep these things for home. Children are encouraged to wear a watch. Could earrings be small studs and not dangling please. Thank you so much for supporting us with this.

We have had new information about the use of childcare vouchers. We understand that most childcare vouchers can be used for Breakfast Club payments. However, they won't be able to used for Tax-Free Childcare for our After School Club, as HMRC require a CIW registration number. Our After School Club is not registered (as most schools with an in-house After School Club) as it is under 2 hours long and therefore doesn't need registering.

Last day of term finish

We have trialled having an early finish on the last day of term. The vast majority of pupils have been collected early: we had less than a dozen children in school at 2pm just before Easter. As it has proved to be popular, we will make this a permanent feature. Children may be collected from 1.30 at the end of each term (not each half term!)

To be clear, children *do not have to* be collected early. Historically, we have had many children leaving early on the last day of term and we are trying to support you. All staff will be on site until the end of the school day. However, there will be no After School Club on the last day of each term.

School Closure

Thank you for your support when we had to close the school because of an issue with our water supply. Most children were collected within half an hour of the 12 o'clock collection time. Thank you.

Please make sure that someone has access to our messaging service whilst your child is at school. In this case we were able to call families of children who were left. That wasn't a problem, although it does take time. However, if we had to go into a lockdown situation we wouldn't be able to call individuals.
