MMR immunisation programme toolkit for primary care (Spring 2024)



This document summarises measles and MMR information to support you and your patients. We encourage all staff to have an awareness of the MMR information sources provided in this toolkit.

MMR and measles facts

Cases of measles have increased across the UK and uptake of the MMR vaccine is declining.



- Measles is a highly infectious illness. It is contagious before symptoms start. Close to 100% of people not vaccinated against measles will catch measles if exposed to the measles virus.
- It can cause serious illness including pneumonia, encephalitis and even death.

- Uptake of the MMR vaccine is declining in Wales. Coverage of 2 doses of MMR in children reaching 5 years of age is 89.3%. Achieving 95% uptake or greater is recommended for countries aiming at measles elimination.
- Unprotected staff who are exposed to measles without PPE may require a 21-day work exclusion.

MMR Vaccination

▪ NHS Routine Childhood Immunisation Programme

Two doses of the MMR vaccine are offered free to all children before they start school at:

- **12-13 months**, and
- **3 years and 4 months**.

The MMR vaccine should not be given to people who are immunosuppressed or who are pregnant.

This is even more reason to ensure that everyone who is eligible has received both MMR doses, to protect those who cannot have the MMR vaccine.

Key messages and actions

- Reassure patients that children and adults of any age who miss any of the doses can still receive them from their GP surgery at any time after they were due. A month is needed between the two doses. Even for individuals who think they have had MMR vaccinations before but aren't sure or have no record of this, it is safe to receive further doses.
- MMR vaccination received under the age of one is not recognised in the UK. Individuals are required to have received their first dose after their first birthday and their second dose after the age of 15 months to be considered to have completed a full course.
- People born before 1970 may have had natural infection and are less likely to be susceptible. However, the MMR vaccine should be offered to these individuals on request or if they are considered to be at high risk of exposure, particularly if they have no documented history of immunity.
- Ensure that all staff have either documented laboratory evidence of immunity to measles or have had a full 2-dose course of MMR vaccine. Where this is not possible, mitigations should be put in place. - Identify your eligible patients who have not had 2 MMR vaccines in the past and offer vaccination.
- Have the **PGDs** and the **Green Book Chapters 21, 23 and 28** available to refer to when discussing vaccination with patients and checking their medical history (see Clinical resources section).
- Ensure that unvaccinated women of childbearing age are offered vaccination before they become pregnant. Following vaccination, pregnancy should be avoided for one month. If it is not possible to vaccinate before pregnancy, vaccination should be deferred until the woman is no longer pregnant.

Getting vaccinated is important. Having the MMR vaccine is the safest, most effective way to protect against measles, mumps and rubella.

- Where vaccination catch-up is being provided by General Practice, including where practices are vaccinating their own staff, the **Children and adults who have outstanding routine immunisations: national supplementary service specification | GOV. WALES** provides a funding route. **NOTE:** All vaccinations given to individuals up to and including 18 years old should be reported to the local child health office for your health board within 7 days of the vaccine being administered (in line with the Child Health Immunisation Process Standards (CHIPS) to ensure accurate and prompt notification of all vaccinations (see item 15 in the NSS).

What's new for 2024 and 2025?

Negeseuon allweddol a chamanu gweithredu

- Nid yw brechiad MMR a dderbynnir dan flwydd oed yn cael ei gydnabod yn y DU. Mae'n ofynnol i unigolion fod wedi cael eu dos cyntaf ar ôl eu pen-blwydd cyntaf a'u hail ddos ar ôl 15 mis oed i'w hystyried fel rhai sydd wedi cwblhau'r cwrs llawn.
